Discussion sessions for parent carers of children and young people with SEND

What is this about?

If nothing changes, we won't have enough places in our special schools for all the children that need them!

The WPCC is organising a series of sessions for **parent carers** to talk about planning for developing and expanding special school provision in Wiltshire.

The local authority has identified that by 2026 there will be a need for 220 extra special school places. There are a lot of issues involved in deciding how to create these new places, while at the same time making sure that provision for all children and young people with SEND continually improves.
